### *Do I need to own an antique car before I join the Region?*

No, you must only want to be a member of the hobby. Many members join before they own a car and obtain advice from members on what type of car and what to look for in a car before they buy one.

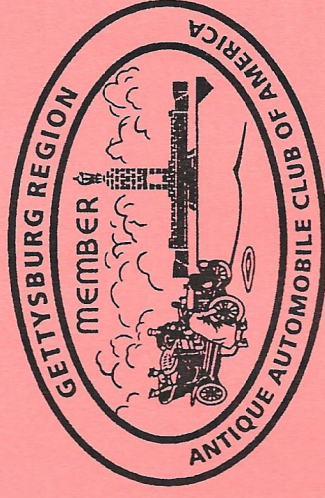
### *What is an antique car?*

A car must be at least 25 years old to be considered an antique. Every year this changes. The car must not be substantially altered; this eliminates modified vehicles from being eligible.

### *Do I have to join the AACA?*

Since the Gettysburg Region is a division of the AACA, all region members must be a member of the AACA. National AACA membership includes many benefits including the bimonthly publication, "Antique Automobile", entrance to many national shows and meets, and discount memberships in many auto-related events and purchases.

## About Our Region

The Gettysburg Region of the Antique Automobile Club of America (AACA) is one of the many geographical regions of the AACA. Our Region was founded in 1952 as the *Brass Car Club*, and became an official AACA region in 1953. It is one of the largest regions in the AACA, with an average membership of 600 plus car enthusiasts.

The Gettysburg Region exists to promote the hobby of antique and classic automobile collectors throughout South Central Pennsylvania. We invite all AACA members in our geographic region to join with us, including those living in the Harrisburg area, the West Shore area, and areas south such as York, and Hanover, as well as Northern Maryland.

Our Region sponsors and/or participates in a diverse number of events during each year, including car tours, car meets, and various social gatherings. Several of these have been ongoing for nearly 60 years, and many are more recent as time evolves and our membership and interests change.

## Activities

### Car Meets and Tours

**Annual G-burg Region Antique Car Show** – Usually held in late spring at the Latimore Valley Fair grounds (next to the Eastern Museum of Motor Racing), this event includes a judged car show, a marque-special vehicle, a flea market, and loads of good food.

**Spring Tour** – This event is usually planned by the Vice-President, and “kicks off” our outdoor season with a tour of the countryside, culminating with a delicious lunch.

**Summer Tour** – Like humans, cars need exercise, and this is another chance to drive your antique or classic car and enjoy our country's beautiful scenery and the camaraderie of fellow members. Lunch included, of course.

**Fall Foliage Tour** – Held in October, this is usually the Region's final outdoor event of the year. This tour allows you to take your antique/classic car for one last spin before winter sets in. This event makes use of the rural byways so that the fall foliage can be enjoyed at its best.

### Social Events

**Sundaes on Sunday** – In January we break the winter blahs with a gathering featuring sundaes with all the “fixings”. This is a free event for members.

**Annual Dinner** – A special dinner is held in February for the purpose of installing new officers for the upcoming year, as well as an annual general meeting of membership.

**Covered Dish Dinner/Hobby Time** – Held in March, this is a great time to share your hobby (whether it is knitting, a special collection, painting, etc.) with fellow Region members, and to enjoy some great food while doing so.

**Annual Picnic** – A summertime event, the date and location for this picnic is at the discretion of the President.

**Nomination Dinner** – This dinner is held in November, and includes a meeting of membership to nominate new officers for the next year.

**Christmas Party** – This festive holiday party is held in December and features a delicious dinner, a visit from Santa, and special entertainment. All members, their children and grandchildren are invited.

In addition to the established events listed above, the Gettysburg Region holds additional car tours, outings, picnics and trips throughout the year. Our Region is known for its friendly people, active schedule, and exciting events.
