



1966 Chevrolet Nova

Owner- Fred & Sue Boone, Newport Perry County

The car was purchased in 2010 from Erie, and needless to say it had extensive rust damage. The entire restoration and modifications were completed by the owners. The front suspension updates include rack and pinion steering, tubular control arms, coil over shocks, and disc brakes. The rear

suspension is a narrowed 9" Ford rear with hand fabricated 4 bar, and coil over shocks. The engine is a 406 C.I. Chevy and 4 speed transmission. The numerous body and interior modifications include, tucked and smoothed bumpers, custom front marker lights. The hood was modified using sections removed from a 68 Chevelle, cowl vent and dash speaker grill filled, relocated gas fill from left rear ¼ panel to under license plate, and custom instrument panel, molded a/c vents, and touch screen stereo with GPS. Since it's completion in 2016 we have logged over 2500 miles enjoying it and going to car shows.

1966 Pontiac Convertible

Owner- Tom Dick


This 1966 Pontiac convertible is owned by Tom Dick. He bought the car on Ebay in 2004 and went to Kansas to get it. The motor was supposed to be a 389 but it had a 400 block. He has done some work to it over the years and has taken it to many car shows, resulting in a nice collection of trophies in the garage!



1967 Pontiac Catalina

Owner- Stewart & Sarah Gardner, Gettysburg PA

Our 1967 Pontiac Catalina 2-door hardtop began life in Virginia. In 1969 Buzz Rinehart obtained the car and then sold the car to Paul and Clara Dorr of Gettysburg. Buzz told me Clara drove the car, but in the winters the car stayed in the garage, while using Paul's truck for snowy weather. Later, Linda Dorr (daughter of Paul and Clara) began driving the car but found its' size too large for her taste. She again returned the car to Buzz Rinehart to sell on consignment. On June 4th, 2001 Sara and I purchased the car. Buzz Rinehart serviced this car for 34 years for the Dorr family. Sarah and I had the car repainted in its' original color of Fathom Blue Poly at the Pontiac dealer in Gettysburg. The car was painted by Todd Cosica, and shortly thereafter Todd opened his own shop, and he continued to oversee restoration of items like new carpet installed by John Geyer, rechroming both bumpers, installing new door sills, and new rubber where necessary and detailing the engine and trunk compartments. The interior of the car is all original except the carpet. In 1967 GM's Pontiac division introduced hidant windshield wipers and safety features such as energy absorbing steering colum, safety steering wheel, dual circuit hydraulic brake system and soft interior parts. She has the original engine 400 cu.in. (265 h.p.) 2 bbl carb and 400 turbo transmission. The clock and AM radio work, and she sports 5 new radial tires. In June of 2013 this automobile attained it's AACA 1st Junior award at the Gettysburg region's National Show held in Carlisle, PA.


